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## Transfers from Fullerton College

Fullerton College has a long history and rich tradition of preparing students for transfer. In his history of Fullerton Junior College, Louis Plummer notes, "regular university courses that are given and credits earned at F.J.C., are accepted at full value at Stanford and other higher institutions of learning." (Plummer, 1949, p. 35.) He further states "the enabling act that gave legal standing to public junior colleges in California provided that courses of study shall approximate the studies prescribed in the first two years of university courses. It was, then, the common conception of educators that the primary function of junior-college courses was to duplicate or parallel courses given during the first two years at the University of California." (Plummer, 1949, p. 112) The college bulletin of 1928-29 listed, as the first type of curriculum offered, The Junior Certificate Curriculum. "This course is designed for those who wish to transfer to a four-year institution with view to obtaining an A.B. or B.S degree." (Plummer, 1949, p. 113)

In 1990, the 101<sup>st</sup> Congress of the United States passed the Student Right to Know and Campus Security Act (Public Law No. 101-542). Title I of this act amended the Higher Education Act of 1965 to require all institutions of higher education participating in any program under HEA title IV (Student Assistance) to disclose the completion or graduation rate of certificate- or degree-seeking, full-time students entering those institutions and set forth formulas for determining such rates. Fullerton College publishes the graduation and transfer rates of its first-time, full-time, degree-, certificate-, and transfer-seeking students annually. But because the act was mainly directed at four-year colleges and universities, the formula developed by the U.S. Department of Education has less meaning for community colleges, where nationally only about 3% of students are first-time, full-time, degree-, certificate-, or transfer-seeking students.

Compliance with the Student Right to Know (SRTK) Act requires a cohort study; that is, a group of students who are first-time freshmen, who are enrolled full-time in a fall term, and are degree seeking, have their outcomes measured over a period of time. The outcomes that the two SRTK rates measure are Completion (the total number of students in the cohort who earn either a degree, a certificate, or who successfully complete a two-year-equivalent transfer-preparatory program) and Transfer (the total number of cohort non-completers who were identified as having enrolled in another

institution). The tracking period of the cohorts is three (3) years, at which time the SRTK rates are calculated and made public.

The four-year college and university bias in SRTK is evident in the requirement that only non-completers be included in the calculation of the transfer rate. So the Fullerton College SRTK transfer rate is based on students that transfer without completing a degree. Students who have completed a degree and then transfer are explicitly excluded in the calculation of the transfer rate. But in developing a data collection and reporting system to comply with the requirements of the act, the California Community College Chancellor's Office began collecting data that does provide a more informative look at transfers.

Beginning with the 1993 cohort of first-time students (students who enrolled in any California community college for the first time in Fall 1993 or Spring 1994) and continuing with subsequent cohorts, the Chancellor's Office matches student records with the University of California (UC), the California State University (CSU) and the National Student Clearinghouse (NSC) to identify students who have enrolled at another college or university. The inclusion of data matches with the NSC permits identification of transfers to private colleges and universities in California and out-of-state private and public colleges and universities. The cohort includes all first-time students, not just those who enroll full-time. The subset of students who enroll full-time in their first term is used to create the SRTK graduation and transfer rates. Students with the goal of transferring are identified based on the goal stated during matriculation, while other transfer rates use a behavioral measure that takes into account units earned and enrollment in transfer level English and math courses (Meehan, 2002).

The data matches of student records with UC, CSU, and NSC are made available to college researchers and others for additional analyses. These data form the basis for the following descriptions and analyses of Fullerton College transfers. The data matches of first-time students with UC, CSU, and NSC are first done three years after the beginning of each cohort. So cohorts from 1993 through 2000 are included in this report. Since 1993, there have been a total of 33,759 first-time stu-

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dents enrolled at Fullerton College. Of these students, 6,808 students have transferred to a four-year college or university. While it is tempting to compute a transfer rate from these data, not all of these students have expressed a goal of transfer nor have they all behaved in a manner that directs them to transfer. In fact, only 12,764 students expressed a goal of transfer.

The following tables indicate the transfer destinations for these students. (It should also be noted that many students have transferred to several institutions; only the first four-year transfer institution is reported here).

It is evident that the largest percentage of Fullerton College students that transfer do so to a California State University. But it is interesting to note that a greater percent of Fullerton College students transfer to private California colleges and universities than to the University of California. And approximately 100 students each year transfer to out of state institutions.

It is not surprising that the majority of Fullerton College transfers are to UC Irvine and UCLA. But 40% of Fullerton College transfers are to the other campuses of UC.

It is also not surprising that Fullerton College students transfer in large numbers to California State University, Fullerton. And the other CSU campuses within close proximity to Fullerton College, Long Beach and Pomona, account for the majority of the remaining CSU transfers. But each CSU campus has received Fullerton College transfers over the past seven years.

Asians transfer to UC at a higher rate than other ethnic groups. Hispanics transfer to CSU at a higher rate than the college average. African Americans transfer to California private and out-of-state colleges and universities at a much higher rate than the college average.

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One additional way to identify transfers relies on a behavioral measure of intent to transfer. The California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office Transfer Rate Technical Workgroup (Perry, 2002) identified the completion of 12 units as a threshold for inclusion of students in the transfer cohort for purposes of computing a transfer rate in response to a legislative demand for the identification of "persistently low transfer colleges." While there is some overlap between the stated goal of students and the behavior of students, there is a significant number of students that either (1) were not first time students at Fullerton College or (2) did not express the intent to transfer at matriculation but (3) completed 12 units at Fullerton College. The following tables indicate the transfer destinations of students who (1) were enrolled at Fullerton College beginning with the fall 1997 term and (2) completed 12 units at Fullerton College. The students identified in the following transfer tables are independent of the students identified in the previous tables, that is, there is no overlap in the groups of students.

The most remarkable aspect of this table is the sheer number of transfers that appear that are not part of the SRTK cohort. Some students are not included in the SRTK cohort because they began their college study after the 2000-01 academic year and have not yet been matched with transfer destinations for purposes of SRTK; they will eventually be included in subsequent cohorts. Other students did not begin their academic study at Fullerton College but transferred to Fullerton College and nonetheless completed substantial work at Fullerton College. Finally, some students did not express intent to transfer at

matriculation. The Transfer Rate Technical Workgroup discovered that students who indicated that a goal of 'Undecided' transferred at the same rate as those who expressed a goal of 'Transfer.'

While the pattern of transfer is the same for this group as for the SRTK cohorts, the inclusion these students more than doubles the number of transfers from Fullerton College to CSU.
